### Policy Analysis 2025 – Campaign Promises



President-Elect Trump
Vice President Elect J.D. Vance

- Slash the Budget
  - Social safety net programs (SNAP, TANF, Medicaid, SSI, etc.) could experience major cuts/changes
- Trade Wars and Tariffs
  - Based off of previous experience with Trump Administration
    - Loss of export markets for American agriculture
    - + Food banks benefited short-term from TEFAP trade mitigation product
    - Logistic challenges created by policy were ultimately not good for farm partners or the food supply chain
- "Make America Healthy Again"
  - Suggests limits on migrant workers/immigration
  - Reductions in the federal workforce
  - Could have negative impacts on food production, food policy, access, and prices
  - Affordable Care Act, Navigator funding, LFPA, and AmeriCorps programs may be eliminated or cut





- The Republicans still hold the Governor's office, majorities at the statehouse, and a majority on the Supreme court.
- In the House, Democrats gaining 2 seats means that they can now <u>block</u> emergency clauses.
- The House will see 27 new members (17 Republicans, 10 Democrats)

[YOUR ORGANIZATION] respectfully requests your support to increase funding for foodbanks in the FY 2024-2025 State Biennial Budget to help our vulnerable neighbors in these difficult times. For more than two decades, the Second Harvest Food Bank of North Central Ohio (Second Harvest) and the Ohio Association of Foodbanks, Ohio's largest charitable response to hunger, has successfully partnered with the State of Ohio to feed hungry Ohioans through the Ohio Food Program and the Agricultural Clearance Program (OFPACP). Our organization, [VOUR ORGANIZATION], is a member of this vital network that serves the hungry Ohioans in your district.

The Ohio Association of Foodbanks, in partnership with Second Harvest, is respectfully requesting \$50 million per year over the FY 2024-2025 biennium (\$100 million total) to be allocated for the Ohio Food Program & Agricultural Clearance Program and capacity building resources for charitable organizations.

This funding will allow Ohio's statewide hunger relief network to direct the maximum amount of state dollars available to Ohioans who need it most, putting food on the tables of Ohio families, positioning our children to be healthy and ready to learn, protecting the welfare of our senior citizens and other vulnerable populations, and setting the anti-hunger, pro-agriculture standard among states.

Through our partnership with Second Harvest, we benefit directly from their ability to procure center-ofthe-plate and shelf-stable foods and direct surplus and unmarketable agricultural products form nearly 100 Ohio farmers and producers through the state's network of foodbanks and onto the tables of Ohio families, ensuring a source of nutritious, Ohio-raised food for Ohioans experiencing food hardship.

Last year, [Your Organization] distributed nearly XX pounds of fresh produce and shelf-stable foods through these programs, providing XX meals to feed seniors, families and low-income individuals.

Between the \$25 million/year appropriated in the SFY 22-23 budget combined with various pandemic-relief funds (ARPA, CARES) OAF's state appropriation for the previous two years was ~\$50/million year. While \$50 million/year was the largest we'd requested, need continued to demonstrate it was critical that our network maintain funding at this level.


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# SINCE LAST BUDGET (CONT.)

**DEC 2023 and 2024** 2018 Farm Bill Reauthorized (no increase in federal commodities)

**FEB 2024** HB 428 Introduced(increase minimum SNAP benefit to \$50 for older Ohioans (increased awareness of SNAP benefits inadequacy)

**APR 2024** Hunger Study conducted by Ohio Association of Foodbanks





# #1 PRIORITY — FUNDING

### \$50 million/year (\$100 million total)

Feeding Ohio families, supporting children's health, and protecting vulnerable populations. Together, we're leading in <u>anti-hunger and pro-agriculture efforts</u>.

- Procure fruits, vegetables, dairy, protein, and other center-of-the-plate foods
- Safely and efficiently store and distribute foods throughout all of Ohio
- Sustain local capacity to handle and serve healthy and perishable products

# #1 PRIORITY - FUNDING (CONT.)

- It's not everything we need, but the funding would keep the State
  of Ohio on pace with its share of the overall food supply that we
  have to source to keep people from going hungry
  - Ohio Food Programs and Agriculture (OhioCAN)
- It's roughly equal to what we received from 2024-2025; high food costs continue to impact our ability to meet the increased historic level of need – Ohioans desperately need more help
- Asking for more would be viewed as unreasonable; we recognize the difficulty in the budget and only ask what we need to sustain.

## ADDITIONAL ADVOCACY EFFORTS

#### **Older Adult \$50 Minimum SNAP Benefit legislation**

Bi-partisan joint sponsors in the Ohio House last session.

#### **Hunger-Free Campus**

- Ensure college students have access to food to promote learning
- Reached out to Rep. Brennen leading the effort, requested Rep. Manning to join

#### Maintaining/Expanding Healthy School Meals for All

- Reduced-price meal category currently being offset with state funding (no cost to families, schools reimbursed the same as free meal category)
- Hunger-Free Schools Ohio campaign pushing for universal no-cost meals
- Unclear on cost for 2026-27, as additional schools attained CEO eligibility


